PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE FOR AUGUST

Rotary International is active in many different "causes" that impact our local area and the world as a whole. We have been hearing about one of those areas through our programs over the last month, as we have heard about the local educational organizations. Supporting Education is a major cause for Rotary. So how does Rotary support education, you ask.

Mentoring students is one way Rotary supports education. An illustration of this is a program in St. Joseph, MI where Rotarian business leaders are paired with local students to help them discover their career aspirations and determine how to make those aspirations come true. Over 400 students were helped to see what their dream careers might look like by the mentors whom they were paired with. Through this mentoring program, students started Interact Clubs at six local schools to also foster the community service aspects of Rotary in the students. Meanwhile the students have a mentor that can help them as they pursue their career goals.

Another area that Rotary supports education is through Teacher Training. In particular with teachers that are working with vulnerable populations. Rotarians are able to share our experience and knowledge with educators and other professionals to enhance the educational experience of the vulnerable.

We also are taking an active role in fighting adult illiteracy, by working with local advocacy groups to offer adult literacy programs. Rotary members throughout the U.S. have partnered with a Detroit, MI group, ProLiteracy Detroit, to recruit and train reading tutors after it was recognized that over 50% of the local adult population was functionally illiterate. This resulted in 500 adults raising their reading levels by three grades.
