Brookings Club Takes the Lead on End Human Trafficking Global Grant

The Rotary Club of Brookings voted last year to take the lead role in a District 5610 Rotary Global Grant aimed at ending human trafficking. Unlike other efforts such as billboards that focus on reporting suspected trafficking and target individuals who believe they are being trafficked, the proposed project will focus on creating resiliency in South Dakota communities that will **prevent** individuals from being trafficked. It is a preemptive approach.

The essence of the proposal is to train individuals who will then inform businesses in targeted South Dakota communities on how to combat Adverse Childhood Experiences – ACEs – which are known precursors of human trafficking. The goal is to certify businesses and communities as "Resilient." Rotarians will be needed to be trained as presenters and reach out to businesses. The proposal is in the review stage and will be submitted for international partnership in Fall 2022. Partners include the Children's Home Society and the Center for Prevention of Child Maltreatment in South Dakota.
