Our club will be celebrating World Polio Day a little early during our annual Oktoberfest Social on October 19th from 5:30-7:00 at Wooden Legs Brewery. Seth has promised an "All South Dakota" beer sampling along with turning his kitchen manager, Joe, loose on a host of German appetizers. Cost of the event will be \$25 per person or \$40 per couple, with the proceeds from the event supporting PolioPlus. The evening is limited to the first 50 attendees. The effort to eradicate polio began in 1979, when Rotary clubs started a project to vaccinate 6 million children in the Philippines. It was not until 1985 that eradication of polio became a goal of the whole organization and the PolioPlus campaign was launched to support the eradication of polio worldwide. Since that time, Rotarians have donated more than 1 billion dollars to the cause. When we started PolioPlus, more than 125 countries were facing a polio epidemic. (continued on back)

Rotary Program for October 6 will be the Visiting Ukrainian Leaders

Six Ukrainian leaders will participate in a number of professional and cultural events while in Brookings Oct. 2-10. These activities have been arranged by the South Dakota World Affairs Council, which arranged similar visits in 2011, 2012 and 2013. These six individuals, who are participating in the Open World Program, will review nongovernmental organizations and civil society development.

Managed by the independent Open World Leadership Center, Open World enables emerging Eurasian political and civic leaders to work with their U.S. counterparts and experience American-style democracy at a local level.

Throughout the week, they will listen to presentations and engage in discussion with leaders from a range of private and nonprofit organizations. The delegates, who are employed by nongovernmental organizations in Ukraine, are seeking ideas about fundraising and recruiting and training volunteers.

The delegates arrive in Washington, D.C., Sept. 30 for an orientation that includes a meeting in the office of U.S. Sen. John Thune (R-S .D.).

Their intensive schedule of meetings in Brookings will introduce them to organizations such as the Brookings Economic Development Corporation, South Dakota 4-H, the Children's Museum of South Dakota, the Brookings Boys and Girls Club, Habitat for Humanity, Advance and Brookings Area United Way. They will spend a day at South Dakota State University holding meetings with students who will gain experience in developing a diplomatic relationship using an interpreter. *Editor's note: they will attend ROTARY MEETING OCTOBER 6*

The Open World Leadership Center has awarded a grant to administer this and similar exchanges in 2015. The Open World Program is a unique, nonpartisan initiative of the U.S. Congress designed to build mutual understanding between the United States and Eurasia. More than 19,000 Open World participants have been hosted in all 50 U.S. states since the program's inception in 1999. Delegates range from members of parliament to mayors, from innovative profit directors to experienced journalists, and from political party activists to regional administrators.
