## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE FOR NOVEMBER

#### President's Message

The theme for the Rotary Zone meeting last week in Salt Lake City was "Rotary at the Crossroads". Past Vice President of Rotary International, Greg Podd asked us to rethink Rotary. The number of Rotarians worldwide has remained around 1.2 million for the past 15 years. Since 41% of new Rotarians leave Rotary within the first 5 years, the annual growth of 10% of new Rotarians is negated by roughly 10% leaving our membership. Greg challenged all District leaders to "Rethink Rotary" and to create a vision as to how we desire to Serve Humanity during the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the Paul Harris Foundation. He also emphasized that everything in Rotary starts at the club level for the over 37,000 clubs worldwide.

Julie Aubry, Regional Membership Officer, reminded us that there are no "Rotary Police". The 2016 Council on Legislation resulted in a dramatic shift in the flexibility of local clubs to carry out their Rotary mission with the end of the classification system and fixed weekly meeting times. Julie emphasized that we think about how to make Rotary relevant in our community. An example of this flexibility is our current goal of establishing a satellite club as part of our Brookings Club so that we may meet the needs of a younger, more diverse group of Rotarians in our community. To date in 2016, there have been a total of 24 new cases of polio diagnosed in the countries of Afghanistan, Pakistan and 3 new cases in Nigeria. More importantly, there have not been ANY new cases diagnosed in the past 3 months! We are truly "this close" to eradicating Polio by 2020. If you would like to explore an international project, please consider joining Wheelchairs for Hope for a week in Guatemala in February, 2017. To learn more about international Rotary community and activities, please also consider attending the RI convention in Atlanta from the 10<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> of June, 2017!
